Christina Rawley grew up on a farm in central Massachusetts and is an "early adopter" of energy-efficient housing and food production. Her Master's Degree and Doctoral research at Harvard University Graduate School of Education focused on equity and access issues in education for achieving sustainable community development. In addition to early work with the New Alchemy Institute in the 1970s, she is a founder of GroundWork, a non-profit established in 1987 to promote sustainable development through education of women and children in underserved areas of the world and is a founding member of the Falmouth Climate Action Team.
