Joe Arruda – President 2010 is a graduate of Bridgewater State College and has academic training in environmental and marine biological science gained through graduate study work in Mari-culture. Mr. Arruda's professional career includes business management positions at Monsanto, Atlas Copco, Applied Materials and Kawasaki Companies. In addition to serving on the Board of Save Bristol Harbor, Mr. Arruda serves on the Board of the Kickemuit River Council.

Robert Aldrich 2012 has an educational background in Mechanical Engineering, Engineering and Program Management and holds an MBA from Babson College. He is retired from Raytheon Company where he was the Director of Operations for the Naval and Maritime Systems business. Since 2000, Mr. Aldrich has actively supported the Rotary Club of Middletown, RI efforts on behalf of Cambodia. He is currently the Project Director for all ongoing phases of Health, Pure Water and Literacy for CAMBODIA Project, an international humanitarian effort to bring clean water and literacy to rural villages in northern Cambodia. Mr. Aldrich serves as a member of the Bristol Zoning Ordinance Review Committee, an alternate member of the Redevelopment Agency, and served as a team leader on the Comprehensive Plan Update in 2008. He is a former member of the Northeast Board of Directors of the Association of Manufacturing Excellence.

Stephan Brigidi 2010. Mr. Brigidi has taught photography and painting at the Universities of Hawaii and Connecticut, Rhode Island College, Providence College, Roger Williams University and for 20 years at RI School of Design. He is a Fulbright-Hays Fellow, a MacDowell Fellow and the recipient of various awards and grants for photography, including a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship. He has extensively exhibited and published his work throughout the United States and Europe and is represented in the collections of more than two-dozen museums in the US and Europe. Mr. Brigidi is the author of two books: Angels of Pomeii, with co-author, Robert Bly, and Remarkable People: A Rhode Island Family Album- a book of portraits. Together with his wife Julie, they founded The Bristol Workshops in Photography Ltd., a fine art - commercial studio & school, now celebrating 25 years in business. Mr. Brigidi is an architectural preservationist serving on the Historic District Commission in Bristol and the Town's Open Space Commission. A committed civil libertarian, he formerly served as a member of the Board of the RI ACLU. He is a past president of Save Bristol Harbor.

Dr. Loren B. Byrne 2012 earned his Ph.D. in ecology from Penn State University and taught for a year at the College of Wooster in OH. His research expertise is on soil ecology and urbanized ecosystems with an emphasis on the ecology and sustainable management of lawns and gardens. Dr. Byrne has been an Assistant Professor in the Department of Biology, Marine Biology and Environmental Science at Roger Williams University in Bristol, RI since the fall of 2007.

Cara Cromwell 2012 graduated from Mount Holyoke with a B.A. in History and Politics and was Mount Holyoke's nominee for the Harry S. Truman Scholarship. She has more than 15 years experience in politics and public affairs, providing communications counsel and strategic recommendations for clients that include corporations, candidates, trade associations and coalitions. Ms. Cromwell served as Executive Press Assistant to Rhode Island Governor Bruce Sundlun where she coordinated press conferences and media coverage. Ms. Cromwell also served as Director of Policy and Research in the successful Sundlun '92 reelection campaign and as Opposition Research Director in the victorious 1990 Sundlun for Governor campaign.
