As the facilitator of the River-Lab program, MRWC offers a unique, hands-on environmental science program that educates children in grades 3-6 about river basin systems. The classroom training that contributes roughly one-third of the science curriculum in Fairfield schools is enhanced by study-trips to the Mill River and town estuaries. MRWC provides classroom materials and activities for students, extensive training for study-trip guides, and professional development for teachers. Each year, more than 160 volunteers guide over 3,500 children through more than 650 study-trips. With its dedicated board, knowledgeable volunteers, and generous donors, the MRWC is poised to continue providing this valuable service to the community.
